Types of Trusts

- A. Private
- B. Charitable
- C. Non-Charitable Purpose



Private Trust

A. Examples

- 1. Revocable Living Trust
- 2. Irrevocable Life Insurance Trust
- 3. Dynasty Trust
- 4. Intentionally Defective Grantor Trust

Private Trust

B. Elements

- 1. Grantor (settlor, trustor)
- 2. Trustee
- 3. Beneficiary
- 4. Trust Corpus (principal)
- 5. Trust protector



Charitable Trust

- A. Purposes
- B. Elements
 - 1. Grantor
 - 2. Trustee
 - 3. No identifiable beneficiary



Non-Charitable Purpose Trust

- A. Meets a particular non-charitable purpose
- B. Examples
 - 1. Trust for maintenance of graves or monuments
 - 2. Trust for saying of masses and other religious services
 - 3. Trust for animals
 - 4. Gun trusts

Non-Charitable Purpose Trust

- C. Legal issues
 - 1. No beneficiary
 - 2. Violates the rule against perpetuities
- D. Current Law
 - 1. Uniform Probate Code allows for Honorary Trusts
 - 2. Michigan statutes (MCL §700.2722)

Pet Trust

A. Statute

- 1. For the care of a designated domestic or pet animal
- 2. Trust terminates when no living animal is covered by the trust
- 3. Trust shall be liberally construed



Pet Trust

- B. Why have a pet trust?
 - 1. Who will take care of the pet?
 - 2. Where will funds come from to pay for the care of the pet?
 - 3. What care will be provided to the pet?



Pet Trust

C. Typical Provisions

- 1. Trustee and successor
- 2. Caregiver
- 3. Adequate duration of trust
- 4. Adequate funding
- 5. Pets to be kept together if appropriate
- 6. Trust protector

- 7. Don't incentivize the death of the pet
- 8. Instructions for standard of living and care of the pet
- 9. Wallet card
- 10. Compensation to trustee and caregiver
- 11. Identify animal specifically
- 12. Sample provisions of a pet trust

Gun Trust

- A. Separate trust
- B. Facilitates passing of firearms to heirs
- C. Avoids paperwork required for additional transfers
- D. Can own general firearms or NFA firearms



Gun Trust

E. NFA firearms

- 1. Short barrel shotgun
- 2. Short barrel rifle
- 3. Machine gun

- 4. Any other weapon
- 5. Any silencer
- 6. A destructive device



Gun Trust

F. Trust provisions

- 1. State the purpose of the trust
- 2. Trust name
- 3. Provide for trustee and qualifications of the trustee
- 4. Stand-alone trust
- 5. Provide for continued ownership of the firearms for the benefit of grantor's family
- 6. Laws and regulations regarding firearms are continually changing
